EMC Grooms Graduates for Labour Market

Variety of job readiness and support services

eThekweni Maritime Cluster (EMC) in partnership with eThekweni Municipal Academy and the National Youth Development Agency (NYDA) hosted a Workshop on the 20th of February 2018. The first session was themed 'Work Readiness'. This is an initiative managed by EMC's Training & Skills Development Unit.

The Graduate Development & Placement Programme aims to expose graduates to work experience in the maritime industry. This program aims to provide a variety of job readiness and support services to employees that are entering the labour market for the first time. The work readiness workshop empowers graduates with knowledge on how to prepare CVs and how to conduct successful interviews. The program is targeted at graduates that want to enter the labour market but have no previous work experience, and the inaugural workshop was attended by 40 unemployed graduates.

The beneficiaries of this informative workshop subsequently attended a one day Emotional Intelligence program. This workshop was aimed at preparing them on how to conduct themselves professionally in the workplace. It addressed first time employee's fears, expectations of the corporate world and provided guidance on how to manage their emotions in the work environment.

One of the workshop participants was Nonsikelelo Ngubane, who said that the workshop had been a learning curve for her. She further highlighted the importance of this workshop as many young graduates are not able to write a detailed CV to market themselves effectively to employers.

EMC hopes to place 39 graduates within the maritime industry.

Durban Port Operators Awarded for Excellence

Port of Durban terminal operators were acknowledged for their role in the success of South Africa's busiest commercial seaport at the Transnet National Ports Authority (TNPA) Port of Durban Customer Awards held on Wednesday, 21 February 2018 at the Durban International Convention Centre.

Durban Port Manager Moshe Motlohi said the Awards - hosted for the first time in 2016 - were important in recognizing operators' compliance with stringent operating standards set by the authority.

"Close collaboration with our licensed terminal operators aids us as we strive to improve port efficiency, increase productivity and instill operations oversight as part of our licensing conditions. We would not be able to fulfil our role without them," he said.

The awards followed a customer breakfast at which TNPA and its clients dissected the theme of 'Big Ship Readiness'. This looked at how the port could be improved to better accommodate the larger commercial vessels now calling more frequently.

Transnet Concludes Agreement for New Helicopters

Improved Operational Efficiency & Safety at TNPA

Transnet National Ports Authority (TNPA) has concluded negotiations and signed an agreement for the manufacture, supply and delivery of two new helicopters to service the Ports of Durban and Richards Bay.

The AgustaWestland (AW 109) helicopters, valued at around R250 million, are being procured from Leonardo S.p.A., formerly Leonardo-Finmeccanica, Finmeccanica and AgustaWestland. They are expected to be delivered by June 2019.

This Italian global high-tech company is headquartered in Rome and is one of the key players in aerospace, defence and security. South Africa is understood to be one of only three countries in the world that offer the unique Helicopter Marine Pilotage Service. The AW109 series includes a twin engine and a harbour pilot kit that features a hoist to enable this unique operation.

TNPA Chief Executive, Shulami Qalinge, said clients would welcome the prospect of improved operational efficiency and safety in TNPA's marine aviation service.



She noted that Richards Bay and Durban are the only ports in South Africa's complementary port system which use helicopters to transfer marine pilots onto and off visiting vessels. TNPA have an existing fleet of three AW109 helicopters and the transaction forms part of the Fleet Replacement Programme.

"We are therefore delighted that we are now in a position to respond to long-time industry calls. The acquisition of new helicopters has been a priority for us under the Transnet Market Demand Strategy which among others seeks to improve operational efficiency and safety in our ports," noted Ms Qalinge.

The contract for the new helicopters includes a 25% supplier development obligation by the global supplier to ensure that the contract creates socio-economic benefits within South Africa.

These would include job creation, skills development and where possible use of local, empowered companies and local materials or parts.
